# Barry ZeVan, Emcee

Barry ZeVan will always be remembered here in the Twin Cities as KSTP-TV's "Peek-a-Boo" Weatherman, garnering a record-breaking 51 percent share of the audience with his infectious presentation. Barry's career started in Pittsburgh, singing on KDKA radio when he was just five years old. He was trained as an actor in New York and appeared on several national TV series and radio shows. He served as a Meteorological Technician while in the Air Force, becoming one of the country's first formally trained TV weathermen. After stints on TV stations in Montana, Canada, Hawaii, and Las Vegas, he came to KSTP-TV in 1970 and became immediately popular for his energetic and engaging style. He also hosted The Ski Scene, about his favorite avocation. With regret, he left Minnesota in 1974, but returned in 1983 to KARE-TV as entertainment editor, weekend weatherman, and ski show host. Among Barry's many subsequent accomplishments is his 2006 Telly Award-winning documentary American Indian Homelands, which was featured on PBS and ABC stations nationwide. Barry continues to be a fixture on local media, delivering unique perspectives on his broadcasting career, travels via his Emmy-nominated documentaries, and the many celebrities with whom he worked, who were and are his lifelong close friends.

# **UKRANIANS ARRIVE**

On September 7, a delegation of five Ukrainian Health Care Professionals, one Interpreter, and one Coordinator will come to the FFMNTC through the Open World Leadership Center (OWLC) in Washington, D.C. OWLC is an independent government agency of the United States Congress, in the Legislative Branch. Since 1999, OWLC has administered the Open World program, a series of ten-day exchange and partnership programs in all 50 states. They are designed to enhance understanding and cooperation between the Congress, American communities, and global leaders. OWLC awards grants to U.S. educational and non-profit organizations, such as FFI, which invites Clubs to participate. Open World delegates (average age 34) stay with volunteer host families, providing a rich cross-cultural experience. OWLC currently conducts programs for delegates from Russia, Ukraine the Caucasus, Central Asia, Estonia, Kosovo, Moldova, Serbia and Mongolia. FFMNTC has hosted OWLC delegations several times before.

As a recipient of a grant from OWLC, we in the Minnesota Twin Cities Friendship Force are charged with providing education and experiences focusing on the assigned theme: Health Care Management and Quality Assurance Rationale. Ukraine is undergoing significant reform of its health care system. One of the main goals of this reform is an efficient allocation of funds for a new National Health Service that will focus specifically on procurement. They envision a health care system that reforms primary, emergency, and palliative care simultaneously and they aim to introduce medical insurance into the daily life of Ukrainians. Health care managers and practitioners look to this OWLC program in Minnesota to learn from the American experience and health care debate what might work best for the Ukrainians.

With this powerful directive from Open World, our Coordinator Tom Scott has been very busy preparing. This has included communications with the OWLC in Washington and with FFI

Regional Support in Atlanta. Locally, Tom and his committee have met with health care and government officials to determine which Minnesota health care professionals and clinics and which government leaders can best provide information and guidance to the Ukrainian delegation during one short week. Former Minnesota Health Commissioner Dr. Ed Ehlinger is among those who have guided Tom and his committee in creating a strong and meaningful program.




Outbound 2019 may be in partnership with another Midwestern club to destinations yet to be determined.
