Most of us have had the opportunity to see many countries and continents, and make friends in new and strange places. How lucky we have been! Now, our adventures are on hold. No foreign travel. No domestic travel. No gatherings. Trips to the grocery store are taken with caution, some of us even avoid that simple errand in favor of food delivery to our homes. The COVID-19 pandemic touches us all in many ways. We live in fear for family and friends, and with the loneliness that comes from not seeing our loved ones. Six feet seems to be a vast distance these days. But something else has changed as well, a closeness has emerged that we used to take for granted. As I look out my window, I see families walking or biking down the road, probably quarantined together. Toddlers to teenagers are home with mom and dad and sharing this strange experience together. Some had to choose with whom they will share the risks of the disease that is all around us. This is all new to me, even as one of the Club members with the longest trail of years behind me. Most of us will get through this, but I doubt if the world will be same as it has been for most of our lives.

The COVID-19 pandemic is having a significant impact on Friendship Force. The wonderful intimacy of Friendship Force homestays is among the things we must forego, at least for now. Our age cohort that includes folks who travelled on the very first Friendship Force Exchange, is in a high-risk category based on age alone. We are among those who need to stay home, keep our distance, and learn to show our love for our kids and grand-kids virtually. We can do it. We can face the challenge.

The characteristics that define Friendship Force today, making new friends through homestays, and our current population of elders, ironically, make it unwise to continue our programs and activities at this time. The FFMNTC Board reluctantly voted to cancel the Inbound Journey from Los Angeles, CA scheduled for May 2020 and the 2020 FFI Super Regional Conference scheduled for September 2020. We have also suspended our local cultural explorations until it is safe to resume them. At this time, everything on the schedule below is tentative.
