FFI COVID-19 Donations from FFMNTC

Friendship Force International (FFI) reached out to clubs around the world for financial support to enable the organization to continue its program of making friends through domestic and international homestays. FFI has lost its income from journeys and events due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Some staff have been furloughed and those remaining are working at 80% time. Reaching a goal of \$340,000 will ensure that Friendship Force will stay strong through this pandemic and will have the staff available to facilitate future Journeys and club gatherings. As of July 7, FFI has received \$331,440.63 of the \$340,000 goal. FFMNTC individual members donated a total of \$1485. Our Board of Directors voted to match members' donations from Club funds (up to \$2500), so with the matching funds FFMNTC donated \$2970 to the FFI fundraiser.
